## QUIET PERIOD FOR THE CRICKET COMMUNICATIONS, INC. AND NTCH, INC. FORBEARANCE PROCEEDING

WC Docket No. 09-197

Quiet Period Begins: September 5, 2011

On June 26, 2009, the Commission adopted the *Forbearance Procedures Order*, which put in place procedural rules governing forbearance petitions under section 10 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the Act). Specifically, section 1.58 of the Commission's rules provides for a two-week quiet period before the statutory deadline for Commission action in forbearance proceedings. As indicated in the *Forbearance Procedures Order*, this public notice announces the beginning of the two-week quiet period. 4

Cricket Communications (Cricket) and NTCH, Inc. (NTCH) each filed a petition requesting that the Commission forbear from applying the requirements of section 214(e)(5) of the Act, and section 54.207 of the Commission's rules, to the extent that those provisions require that the service area of a competitive eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) conform to the service area of any rural telephone company serving the same area, for the limited purpose of becoming designated as Lifeline-only ETCs.<sup>5</sup> The statutory date on which Cricket's forbearance petition shall be deemed granted, in the absence of a Commission denial of the petition, is September 19, 2011.<sup>6</sup> Because the Cricket Forbearance Petition and the NTCH Forbearance

Petition request similar relief, the Commission intends to address the two petitions simultaneously. We therefore apply the quiet period required by section 1.58 of the Commission's rules to both the Cricket Forbearance Petition and the NTCH Forbearance Petition. Based on the statutory deadline for Cricket, the quiet period for this proceeding **begins** on September 5, 2011.<sup>7</sup>

Section 1.58 extends the prohibition in section 1.1203(a) (governing contacts with decision makers concerning matters listed in the Sunshine Agenda) to petitions for forbearance "for a period of 14 days prior to the statutory deadline." Accordingly, all presentations to decision makers concerning the Cricket forbearance proceeding, whether *ex parte* or not, are prohibited during the two-week quiet period, beginning September 5, 2011.9
