DOMESTIC SECTION 214 APPLICATION FILED FOR THE TRANSFER OF CONTROL OF SELECTEL, INC.

STREAMLINED PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED

On October 13, 2011, SelecTel, Inc. (SelecTel or Applicant) filed an application pursuant to section 63.03 of the Commission's rules¹ to transfer control of the company from Lanz Jackson to Matt O'Flaherty, Teri O'Flaherty, and Stacy Hergenrader, all U.S. citizens.

SelecTel, a Nevada corporation, is currently authorized to provide interexchange services in the District of Columbia, Florida, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, and Washington. Lanz Jackson is the current 100 percent owner of SelecTel. Pursuant to the terms of the proposed transaction, Mr. Jackson will transfer all of the issued and outstanding shares of SelecTel to Matt O'Flaherty (33.33 percent), Teri O'Flaherty (33.33 percent), and Stacy Hergenrader (33.33 percent). Applicant states that none of the transferees has an ownership interest in any other telecommunications entity. Applicant asserts that the proposed transaction is entitled to presumptive streamlined treatment under section 63.03(b)(2)(i) of the Commission's rules, and that a grant of the application will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity.
