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COMMENTS INVITED ON APPLICATION OF QWEST COMMUNICATIONS COMPANY, LLC D/B/A CENTURYLINK QCC TO DISCONTINUE INTERCONNECTED VOIP SERVICES

On November 17, 2011, Qwest Communications Company, LLC d/b/a CenturyLink QCC (CenturyLink or Applicant), located at **100 CenturyLink Drive, Monroe, Louisiana 71203**, filed an application with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC or Commission) requesting authority, under section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and section 63.71 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, to discontinue the provision of a certain interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) service in Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Iowa, Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming (collectively Service Areas). By an amendment filed on December 6, 2011, CenturyLink corrected certain deficiencies in its initial application and updated the record regarding notice to customers. Accordingly, CenturyLink's application is deemed complete as of December 6, 2011.

CenturyLink indicates that it currently offers a consumer VoIP telephone service in the Service Areas by the name of Broadband Phone Service (BPS). CenturyLink explains that BPS allows consumers to place telephone calls over their broadband Internet service. CenturyLink maintains, however, that BPS has not been commercially successful and CenturyLink currently has fewer than 30 BPS customers in several of the states where it is offered. CenturyLink proposes to discontinue BPS in the Service Areas on December 30, 2011, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals can be obtained. CenturyLink suggests that current BPS customers will have the option of moving to a comparable voice and long distance offering from CenturyLink or switching to a different provider. CenturyLink indicates that, between November 14 and November 17, 2011, it sent notice by U.S. Mail to all affected customers in accordance with the requirements of section 63.71(a) of the Commission's rules. CenturyLink asserts that it is considered non-dominant with respect to the service to be discontinued.

In accordance with section 63.71(c) of the Commission's rules, CenturyLink's application will be deemed to be granted automatically on the 31st day after the release date of this public notice, unless the Commission notifies CenturyLink that the grant will not be automatically effective. In the application, CenturyLink indicates that it plans to discontinue BPS in the Service Areas on December 30, 2011, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals can be obtained. Accordingly, pursuant to section 63.71(c) and the terms of CenturyLink's application, absent further Commission action, CenturyLink may terminate its provision of BPS in the Service Areas on or after **January 6, 2012**. The Commission normally will authorize proposed discontinuances of service unless it is shown that customers or other end users would be unable to receive service or a reasonable substitute from another carrier, or that the public convenience and necessity would be otherwise adversely affected.

This proceeding is considered a “permit but disclose” proceeding for purposes of the Commission’s ex parte rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.1200-1.1216. Comments objecting to this application must be filed with the Commission on or before **December 21, 2011**. Such comments should refer to **WC Docket No. 11-196 and Comp. Pol. File No. 1025**. Comments should include specific information about the impact of this proposed discontinuance on the commenter, including any inability to acquire reasonable substitute service. Comments may be filed using the Commission’s Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies. See *Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998). Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <http://fjallfoss.fcc.gov/ecfs2/>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the Web site for submitting comments. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. In completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number.

Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and one copy of each filing. Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail. All filings must be addressed to the Commission’s Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission. All hand-delivered or messenger-delivered paper filings for the Commission’s Secretary must be delivered to FCC Headquarters at 445 12th Street, S.W., Room TW-A325, Washington, D.C. 20554. The filing hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. All hand deliveries must be held together with rubber bands or fasteners.
