## WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON THE CITIZENS TEL COOP PETITION FOR WAIVER OF A HIGH-COST UNIVERSAL SERVICE FILING DEADLINE

The Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on a petition filed by Citizens Tel Coop for waiver of a filing deadline required by section 54.314(d) of the Commission's rules for receipt of high-cost universal service support. Section 54.314(d), among other things, sets forth the deadline for a rural incumbent local exchange carrier that is not subject to state jurisdiction to file an annual certification with the Commission and the Universal Service Administrative Company stating that the carrier "will only use support for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which support is intended," which is required for such a carrier to be eligible to receive high-cost universal service support.

Interested parties may file **comments on or before January 23, 2012**, and **reply comments on or before February 7, 2012**. All pleadings are to reference **WC Docket No. 08-71**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.<sup>3</sup>

This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>4</sup> Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.<sup>5</sup> Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.<sup>6</sup>
