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PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED FOR COMMENTS ON WINDSTREAM PETITION FOR LIMITED WAIVER RELIEF

On February 16, 2011, Windstream Corporation ("Windstream") petitioned the Commission to allow its recently acquired subsidiary, Windstream Lakedale, Inc. ("Lakedale"), to convert from rate-of-return regulation to price cap regulation.¹ Specifically, Windstream requests the "necessary waiver relief to enable Windstream to apply to Lakedale's two study areas the universal service mechanism governing the rest of Windstream's LECs that were converted to price cap regulation under the *Windstream Order*."² Windstream argues that such uniformity of regulatory treatment would "advance the public interest benefits of the *Windstream Order*" and that a grant of the requested relief "would increase consumer welfare by reducing the overall size of the Universal Service Fund ("USF") and enabling Windstream to maintain and enhance efficient operations and thereby generate all the competitive benefits of converting Lakedale to price cap regulation."³ In addition, Windstream requests a limited waiver of Section 61.41(c)(2) of the Commission's rules⁴ so that Lakedale "may continue to operate its study areas under rate-of-return regulation until Windstream's next annual access tariff filing," to be effective on July 1, 2011.⁵ Windstream also requests waiver of Section 69.3(i)(1)⁶ of the Commission's rules so that Lakedale "may notify the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) of its intent to withdraw from NECA tariffs on short notice."⁷

This Public Notice establishes certain procedural requirements relating to consideration of the petition. This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.⁸ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentations and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁹ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.¹⁰
