WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUREAU ANNOUNCES DEADLINES FOR COMMENTS ON SPECTRUM OVER TRIBAL LANDS NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

WTB Docket No. 11-40

On March 3, 2011, the Commission released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) seeking comment on a range of specific proposals and issues concerning the promotion of the greater use of communications spectrum over Tribal lands.¹

The Commission set the comment and reply comment deadlines for the NPRM as 45 and 75 days, respectively, after publication of the summary of the NPRM in the Federal Register.² On April 4, 2011, a summary of the NPRM appeared in the Federal Register.³ Accordingly, interested parties may file **comments on or before May 19, 2011** and **reply comments on or before June 20, 2011.** All pleadings are to reference **WTB Docket No. 11-40.**

Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies.⁴

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/ or the Federal eRulemaking Portal: http://www.regulations.gov. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.
- Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing. If more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this

proceeding, filers must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number. Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail. All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.

- All hand-delivered or messenger-delivered paper filings for the Commission's Secretary must be delivered to FCC Headquarters at 445 12th Street, SW, Room TW-A325, Washington, DC 20554. All hand deliveries must be held together with rubber bands or fasteners. Any envelopes must be disposed of <u>before</u> entering the building.
- Commercial overnight mail (other than U.S. Postal Service Express Mail and Priority Mail) must be sent to 9300 East Hampton Drive, Capitol Heights, MD 20743.
- U.S. Postal Service first-class, Express, and Priority mail must be addressed to 445 12th Street, SW, Washington DC 20554.

This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.⁵ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁶ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.⁷
