THE WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU CONSENTS TO SERVICE AREA REDEFINITION OF FIVE RURAL TELEPHONE COMPANIES IN PENNSYLVANIA SOUGHT BY KEYSTONE WIRELESS, LLC D/B/A IMMIX WIRELESS

WC Docket No. 09-197 WT Docket No. 10-208 AU Docket No. 12-25

The Wireline Competition Bureau consents to proposed service area redefinitions presented by Keystone Wireless, LLC d/b/a Immix Wireless (Keystone) with respect to five rural telephone companies in Pennsylvania. The redefinition consented to is specified in the Order of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission regarding the Petition of Keystone Wireless, LLC d/b/a/ Immix Wireless for Designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Docket No. P-2012-2287339 (adopted May 24, 2012) (*PAPUC Keystone Order*).²

Pursuant to the procedures set forth in section 54.207(c) of the Commission's rules, the Commission and the appropriate state commission must agree on a proposed redefinition of a rural carrier's service area.³ In the *PAPUC Keystone Order*, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission approved of the proposed redefinition subject to the Commission's agreement. The Commission has delegated authority to the Wireline Competition Bureau to act on service area redefinition requests such as that presented in the *Keystone Petition*.⁴

Keystone sought a designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (ETC) from the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission in part to become eligible for funds to be offered in the Mobility Fund, including the upcoming competitive bidding for Phase I of the Mobility Fund, known as Auction

901.⁵ In light of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau's involvement with the Mobility Fund, the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and the Wireline Competition Bureau together sought comment on the *Keystone Petition*.⁶ The *Keystone Petition* was unopposed.⁷
