AT&T MOBILITY SPECTRUM LLC AND DAVID L. MILLER SEEK FCC CONSENT TO THE ASSIGNMENT OF 13 LOWER 700 MHZ BAND B BLOCK LICENSES

I. INTRODUCTION

AT&T Mobility Spectrum LLC ("AT&T Mobility"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of AT&T Inc. (collectively, "AT&T"), and David L. Miller ("Miller") (collectively, "the Applicants") have filed an application pursuant to Section 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, seeking to assign 13 Lower 700 MHz Band B Block licenses from Miller to AT&T Mobility. The Applicants state that the additional spectrum will enable AT&T to increase its system capacity to enhance existing services, better accommodate its overall growth, and facilitate the provision of additional products and services to the public in 13 Cellular Market Areas ("CMAs") in Florida, Georgia, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Texas.

Preliminary review of the application indicates that in two of the three counties (*i.e.*, Sullivan and Wyoming counties) comprising CMA 615 – Pennsylvania 4-Bradford, AT&T would hold, post-transaction, 61 megahertz of spectrum below 1 GHz.

II. SECTION 310(d) APPLICATION

The application for consent to the full assignment of 13 Lower 700 MHz Band B Block licenses from Miller to AT&T has been assigned the following file number:

III. EX PARTE STATUS OF THIS PROCEEDING

Pursuant to Section 1.1200(a) of the Commission's rules,² the Commission may adopt modified or more stringent *ex parte* procedures in particular proceedings if the public interest so requires. We announce that this proceeding will be governed by permit-but-disclose *ex parte* procedures that are applicable to non-restricted proceedings under Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules.³

Parties making oral *ex parte* presentations are directed to the Commission's revised *ex parte* rules. Parties are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must contain the presentation's substance and not merely list the subjects discussed.⁴ More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented is generally required.⁵ Other rules pertaining to oral and written presentations are set forth in Section 1.1206(b) as well.⁶

IV. GENERAL INFORMATION

The assignment application has been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing. The Commission reserves the right to return any application if, upon further examination, it is determined to be defective and not in conformance with the Commission's rules or policies.

Interested parties must file petitions to deny no later than **August 16, 2012**. Persons and entities that file petitions to deny become parties to the proceeding. They may participate fully in the proceeding, including seeking access to any confidential information that may be filed under a protective order, seeking reconsideration of decisions, and filing appeals of a final decision to the courts. Oppositions to such pleadings must be filed no later than **August 27, 2012**. Replies to such pleadings must be filed no later than **September 4, 2012**. All filings concerning matters referenced in this Public Notice should refer to ULS File No. 0005296026.

To allow the Commission to consider fully all substantive issues regarding the Applications in as timely and efficient a manner as possible, petitioners and commenters should raise all issues in their initial filings. New issues may not be raised in responses or replies. A party or interested person seeking to raise a new issue after the pleading cycle has closed must show good cause why it was not possible for it to have raised the issue previously. Submissions after the pleading cycle has closed that seek to raise new issues based on new facts or newly discovered facts should be filed within 15 days after such facts are discovered. Absent such a showing of good cause, any issues not timely raised may be disregarded by the Commission.

Under the Commission's current procedures for the submission of filings and other documents, submissions in this matter may be filed electronically though the Commission's Universal Licensing System ("ULS") or by hand delivery to the Commission.
