NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE MAKING

By the Assistant Chief, Audio Division, Media Bureau:

- 1. The Audio Division has before it a Petition for Rule Making filed by Jesus B. Salazar ("Petitioner"), permittee of KPMJ, Matador, Texas. Petitioner proposes to amend the FM Table of Allotments, Section 73.202(b) of the Commission's rules, by substituting Channel 227A for vacant Channel 249A at Roaring Springs, Texas, and substituting Channel 249C3 for vacant Channel 276C3 at Roaring Springs, Texas. This proposal is part of a contingently filed "hybrid" application and rule making petition.
- 2. **Background.** In his contingent application, Petitioner proposes that FM Station KPMJ be upgraded to operate on FM Channel 276C3 rather than FM Channel 227A. Correspondingly, Petitioner proposes to amend the FM Table of Allotments by substituting Channel 227A for vacant Channel 249A, at Roaring Springs, Texas, and substituting Channel 249C3 for vacant Channel 276C3 at Roaring Springs, Texas. Petitioner asserts that, because the initial auction allotment for Matador was for Channel 227C3, the Matador channel change can be processed as a channel substitution pursuant to Section 73.3573(a)(1)(iv) of the Commission's rules. Petition states that the proposal would serve the public interest because it would result in a potential net gain in population served by the Roaring Spring allotments, and also would increase the number of persons served by new FM Channel KPMJ.
- 3. **Discussion.** The proposed changes in the FM Table of Allotments warrant consideration because they comply with our technical requirements and could serve the public interest. These channel substitutions will allow KPMJ to increase service by implementing an upgrade that would increase the number of the station's potential listeners, and could also produce a net gain in the population served by the Roaring Spring allotments. Accordingly, we seek comment on the proposed amendment of the FM Table of Allotments, 47 C.F.R. Section

73.202(b), with respect to Roaring Springs, Texas, as set forth below:

Proposed Coordinates for Channel 227A at Roaring Springs, Texas: 33-59-36 NL and 100-52-10 WL, at a site 10.5 km (6.5 miles) north of Roaring Springs.

Proposed Coordinates for Channel 249C3 at Roaring Springs, Texas: 33-57-55 NL and 100-47-36 WL, at a site 9.4 km (5.8 miles) northeast of Roaring Springs.

- 4. The Commission's authority to institute rule making proceedings, showings required, cut-off procedures, and filing requirements are contained in the attached *Appendix* and are incorporated by reference herein. In particular, we note that a showing of continuing interest is required in paragraph 2 of the *Appendix* before a channel will be allotted.
- 5. Pursuant to Sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's Rules,³ interested parties may file comments on or before October 15, 2012, and reply comments on or before October 30, 2012, and are advised to read the Appendix for the proper procedures. Comments should be filed with the Federal Communications Commission. Additionally, a copy of any filing should be served on counsel for Petitioner, as follows:

6. Parties must file an original and four paper copies of each filing. - 7. The Commission has determined that the relevant provisions of the Regulatory Flexibility Act of 1980 do not apply to a rule making proceeding to amend the FM Table of Allotments, Section 73.202(b) of the Commission's Rules. This document does not contain proposed information collection requirements subject to the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995, Public Law 104-13. In addition, therefore, it does not contain any proposed information collection burden "for small business concerns with fewer than 25 employees," pursuant to the Small Business Paperwork Relief Act of 2002, Public Law 107-198.

For purposes of these restricted notice and comment rule making proceedings, members of the public are advised that no *ex parte* presentations are permitted from the time the Commission adopts a *Notice of Proposed Rule Making* until the proceeding has been decided and such decision in the applicable docket is no longer subject to reconsideration by the Commission or review by any court. An *ex parte* presentation is not prohibited if specifically requested by the Commission or staff for the clarification or adduction of evidence or resolution of issues in the proceeding. However, any new written information elicited from such a request or any summary of any new information shall be served by the person making the presentation upon the other parties to the proceeding in the particular docket unless the Commission specifically waives this service requirement. Any comment which has not been served on the Petitioner constitutes an *ex parte* presentation and shall not be considered in the proceeding. Any reply comment which has not been served on the person(s) who filed the comment, to which the reply is directed, constitutes an *ex parte* presentation and shall not be considered in this proceeding.

APPENDIX

- 1. Pursuant to authority found in 47 U.S.C. Sections 4(i), 5(c)(1), 303(g) and (r), and 307(b), and 47 C.F.R. Sections 0.61, 0.204(b) and 0.283, IT IS PROPOSED TO AMEND the FM Table of Allotments, 47 C.F.R. Section 73.202(b), as set forth in the *Notice of Proposed Rule Making* to which this *Appendix* is attached.
- 2. Showings Required. Comments are invited on the proposal(s) discussed in the *Notice of Proposed Rule Making* to which this *Appendix* is attached. Proponent(s) will be expected to answer whatever questions are presented in initial comments. The proponent of a proposed allotment is also expected to file comments even if it only resubmits or incorporates by reference its former pleadings. It should also restate its present intention to apply for the channel if it is allotted and, if authorized, to build a station promptly. Failure to file may lead to denial of the request.
- 3. Cut-off protection. The following procedures will govern the consideration of filings in this proceeding.
- (a) Counterproposals advanced in this proceeding itself will be considered, if advanced in initial comments, so that parties may comment on them in reply comments. They will not be considered if advanced in reply comments (*see* 47 C.F.R. Section 1.420(d).)
- (b) Petitions for rule making which conflict with the proposals in this *Notice* will be considered as comments in the proceeding, and Public Notice to this effect will be given as long as they are filed before the date for filing initial comments herein. If they are filed later than that, they will not be considered in connection with the decision in this docket.
- (c) The filing of a counterproposal may lead the Commission to allot a different channel than was requested for any of the communities involved.
- 4. Comments and Reply Comments; service. Pursuant to applicable procedures set out in 47 C.F.R. Sections 1.415 and 1.420, interested parties may file comments and reply comments on or before the dates set forth in the *Notice of Proposed Rule Making* to which this *Appendix* is attached. All submissions by parties to this proceeding or by persons acting on behalf of such parties must be made in written comments, reply comments, or other appropriate pleadings. The person filing the comments shall serve comments on the Puopolos. Reply comments shall be served on the person(s) who filed comments to which the reply is directed. A certificate of service shall accompany such comments and reply comments (*see* 47 C.F.R. Section 1.420(a), (b) and (c).) Comments should be filed with the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission, Washington, D.C. 20554.
- 5. Number of Copies. In accordance with the provisions of 47 C.F.R. Section 1.420, an original and four copies of all comments, reply comments, pleadings, briefs, or other documents shall be furnished the Commission.

6. Public Inspection of Filings. All filings made in this proceeding will be available for examination by interested parties during regular business hours in the Commission's Reference Information Center, at its headquarters, 445 12th Street, S.W., Washington, D.C.
