WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON PETITIONS FOR DESIGNATION AS A LOW-INCOME ELIGIBLE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CARRIER FILED BY FREE MOBILE, ICON AND NEWPHONE WIRELESS

The Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on petitions filed by Free Mobile, Inc. (Free Mobile), <sup>1</sup> ICON Telecom, Inc. (ICON), <sup>2</sup> and NewPhone Wireless, L.L.C. (NewPhone Wireless) <sup>3</sup> for limited designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) for the provision of Lifeline service. Free Mobile, ICON, and NewPhone Wireless each seek designation as an ETC for the limited purpose of offering Lifeline service in Alabama, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, New Hampshire, North Carolina, New York, Tennessee and Virginia. <sup>4</sup>

Pursuant to sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's rules, interested parties may file comments and reply comments on or before the dates indicated on the first page of this document. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS).<sup>5</sup>

Persons making oral ex parte presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex parte presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum.
