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PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED ON AT&T AND NTCA PETITIONS

We establish a pleading cycle on two petitions that urge the Commission to alter policies to respond to the ongoing technological transition of voice networks.

On November 7, 2012, AT&T filed a petition requesting that the Commission open a proceeding "to facilitate the 'telephone' industry's continued transition from legacy transmission platforms and services to new services based fully on the Internet Protocol ('IP')." AT&T requests that the Commission consider conducting trials where certain equipment and services are retired and IP-based services are offered, after a public comment period on how to conduct the trials and on "the ultimate transition to all-IP networks and services."2

On November 19, 2012, the National Telecommunications Cooperative Association filed a petition requesting the Commission to "initiate a rulemaking to examine the means of promoting and sustaining the ongoing evolution of the Public Switched Telephone Network" from TDM to IP. NTCA urges the Commission to seek comment on whether certain regulations should be eliminated, retained or modified to further the Commission's statutory objectives of consumer protection, competition, and universal service.4

Pursuant to sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's rules, 47 CFR §§ 1.415, 1.419, interested parties may file comments and reply comments on or before the dates indicated on the first page of this document. The proceeding this Notice initiates shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's ex parte rules.⁵ Persons making ex parte presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral ex parte presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex parte presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during ex parte meetings are deemed to be written ex parte presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written ex parte presentations and memoranda summarizing oral ex parte presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g., .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's ex parte rules.
