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## WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON ALLBAND COMMUNICATIONS COOPERATIVE PETITION FOR WAIVER OF CERTAIN HIGH-COST UNIVERSAL SERVICE RULES

The Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on a petition filed by Allband Communications Cooperative (Allband) for waiver of two high-cost universal service rules.<sup>1</sup> First, Allband seeks a waiver of section 54.302 of the Commission's rules, which establishes a total limit on high-cost universal service support of \$250 per line per month, beginning July 1, 2012.<sup>2</sup> Second, Allband seeks a waiver of the framework to limit reimbursable capital and operating costs.<sup>3</sup>

Interested parties may file **comments on or before March 14, 2012**, and **reply comments on or before March 29, 2012**. All pleadings are to reference **WC Docket No. 10-90 and WT Docket No. 10-208**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.<sup>4</sup>

This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>5</sup> Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.<sup>6</sup> Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte*

presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.<sup>7</sup>
