The Region 49 (Central Texas)¹ Public Safety Regional Planning Committees (RPCs) will hold two consecutive planning meetings on Tuesday, June 12, 2012. Beginning at 10:00 a.m., the 700 MHz RPC will convene at the Texas Department of Transportation, Cedar Park Campus, Building 51, 9500 N. Lake Creek Parkway, Austin, Texas.

¹ The Region 49 (Texas-Austin) regional planning area consists of the following thirty counties: Bastrop, Bell, Blanco, Bosque, Brazos, Burleson, Burnet, Caldwell, Coryell, Falls, Fayette, Freestone, Grimes, Hamilton, Hays, Hill, Lampasas, Lee, Leon, Limestone, Llano, Madison, McLennan, Milam, Mills, Robertson, San Saba, Travis, Washington, and Williamson.

Both Region 49 Public Safety RPCs' meetings are open to the public. All eligible public safety providers in Region 49 may utilize these frequencies. It is essential that eligible public safety agencies in all areas of government, including state, municipality, county, and Native American Tribal be represented in order to ensure that each agency's future spectrum needs are considered in the allocation process. Administrators who are not oriented in the communications field should delegate someone with this knowledge to attend, participate, and represent their agency's needs.
