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## WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON CORAL WIRELESS REQUEST FOR REVIEW OF USAC DECISION

WC Docket No. 05-337, CC Docket No. 96-45

The Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on a petition filed by Coral Wireless (Coral) requesting review of a final decision of the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) to recover previously paid high-cost support.<sup>1</sup> According to Coral's petition, following an audit, USAC sought to recover funds on the grounds that certain reported lines were not eligible for support because the lines were not revenue generating.<sup>2</sup> Coral argues that USAC incorrectly and inappropriately interpreted the Commission's regulations by requiring that a line be revenue generating in order to be eligible for support.<sup>3</sup> Coral seeks review of this USAC decision. In the alternative, Coral requests a one-time partial waiver of section 54.307(b) or 54.307(e) of the Commission's rules to prevent a reduction in Coral's support.<sup>4</sup>

Pursuant to sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's rules, interested parties may file comments or reply comments on or before the dates indicated above.<sup>5</sup> Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS).<sup>6</sup>

The proceeding this Notice initiates shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>7</sup> Persons making *ex parte* presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the *ex parte* presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during *ex parte* meetings are deemed to be written *ex parte* presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has

made available a method of electronic filing, written *ex parte* presentations and memoranda summarizing oral *ex parte* presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (*e.g.*, .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.
