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WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON PETITIONS FOR DESIGNATION AS LOW-INCOME ELIGIBLE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CARRIERS BY SAGE TELECOM, BLUE WIRELESS, AND I-WIRELESS

The Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) seeks comment on petitions filed by Sage Telecom Communications, LLC (Sage Telecom), ¹ Buffalo-Lake Erie Wireless Systems Co., LLC d/b/a Blue Wireless (Blue Wireless), ² and i-wireless, LLC (i-wireless) ³ for limited designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) for the provision of Lifeline service. Sage Telecom seeks designation for the limited purpose of providing wireless services supported by the Lifeline program in the jurisdictions of Alabama, Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Florida, New Hampshire, New York, North Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia. ⁴ Blue Wireless describes itself as a facilities-based telecommunications carrier ⁵ and seeks designation as a wireless Lifeline ETC in the state of New York, including the Tribal lands of the Allegany Indian Reservation and the Cattaraugus Indian Reservation. ⁶ i-wireless seeks designation for the limited purpose of providing wireless services supported by the Lifeline program in Maine and seeks to expand its designated service area in the state of Texas. ⁷ The Texas

Public Utilities Commission, which no longer designates CMRS resellers as ETCs, previously designated i-wireless in the non-rural areas of the state and i-wireless now seeks to expand its designation into rural areas of Texas.

copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral ex parte presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex parte presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during ex parte meetings are deemed to be written ex parte presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written ex parte presentations and memoranda summarizing oral ex parte presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g., .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf).
