## EX PARTE MEETINGS WITH THE TECHNOLOGY TRANSITIONS POLICY TASK FORCE

### GN Docket No. 13-5

As the Technology Transitions Policy Task Force moves forward in accordance with Chairman Tom Wheeler's blog post, *The IP Transition: Starting Now*, <http://www.fcc.gov/blog/ip-transition-starting-now>, we wish to reiterate the ways in which interested parties can provide input into the work of the Task Force.

Parties requesting meetings with the Task Force should submit requests to [TechTaskForce@fcc.gov](mailto:TechTaskForce@fcc.gov). Any such requests should specify the purpose of the meeting, the issues that the party intends to discuss (including identifying any pending proceedings that may be discussed), and the meeting attendees.

We remind parties that the Commission treats the work of the Technology Transitions Policy Task Force (including both oral meetings and written submissions) as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding, in which *ex parte* presentations to Commission decision-making personnel are permissible but subject to certain disclosure requirements in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>1</sup>

Presentations to the Technology Transitions Policy Task Force as well as any other written submissions should be filed in GN Docket No. 13-5 as well as any other applicable docket, as appropriate.
