On September 23, 2013, the Media Bureau ("Bureau") issued a Public Notice seeking comment on its Catalog of Eligible Expenses and other issues. Comments and replies were originally due on October 31 and November 14, 2013, respectively. On October 17, 2013, when the federal government reopened following a temporary lapse in funding, the Commission released a Public Notice extending the filing deadlines for regulatory and enforcement filings. As a result of the October 17 Public Notice, the filing deadlines for comments and replies in response to the Bureau's September 23 Public Notice have been extended to the dates indicated above.
