ORDER

By the Chief, Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. Consistent with precedent,¹ we grant nine requests from petitioners² seeking review of decisions made by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) under the E-rate program (more formally known as the schools and libraries universal service support program).³ In each case, USAC reduced funding because it found that the applicant failed to timely submit its FCC Form 486. Based on the facts and circumstances of these specific cases, we find that rigid adherence to USAC's procedural deadline is not in the public interest in these cases and we therefore grant these appeals and associated waivers.

2. On our own motion, we also waive section 54.507(d) of the Commission's rules,⁴ and direct USAC to waive any procedural deadlines, such as the invoicing deadline, that might be necessary

to effectuate our ruling.⁵ We find good cause to waive section 54.507(d) because filing an appeal of a denial of funding is likely to cause petitioners to miss the program's subsequent procedural deadlines in that funding year. Consistent with precedent,⁶ we also find that good cause exists to waive section 54.720(a) of the Commission's rules,⁷ which requires applicants to seek review of a USAC decision within 60 days, for New York City Montessori Charter School, because it submitted its appeal to the Commission only two days late.

3. We therefore remand the applications listed in the Appendix to USAC for further action consistent with this order. To ensure that those applications are resolved expeditiously, we direct USAC to complete its review of each application listed in the Appendix, and issue a funding commitment or denial based on a complete review and analysis, no later than 90 calendar days from the release date of this order. In remanding these applications to USAC, we make no finding as to the ultimate eligibility of the services or as to the petitioners' applications.

4. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to the authority contained in sections 1-4 and 254 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151-154 and 254, and sections 0.91, 0.291, 1.3 and 54.722(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, 1.3 and 54.722(a), that the requests for review or waiver listed in the Appendix ARE GRANTED and those applications ARE REMANDED to USAC for further consideration in accordance with the terms of this order.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to the authority contained in sections 1-4 and 254 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151-154 and 254, and sections 0.91, 0.291, and 1.3 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, and 1.3, that section 54.507(d) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 54.507(d), IS WAIVED for the petitioners listed in the Appendix to the limited extent provided herein.

6. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to the authority contained in sections 1-4 and 254 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151-154 and 254, and sections 0.91,

The Commission may exercise its discretion to waive a rule where the particular facts make strict compliance inconsistent with the public interest. *Northeast Cellular Telephone Co. v. FCC*, 897 F.2d 1164, 1166 (D.C. Cir. 1990) (*Northeast Cellular*). In addition, the Commission may take into account considerations of hardship, equity, or more effective implementation of overall policy on an individual basis. *WAIT Radio v. FCC*, 418 F.2d 1153, 1159 (D.C. Cir. 1969); *Northeast Cellular*, 897 F.2d at 1166. Waiver of the Commission's rules is appropriate only if both (i) special circumstances warrant a deviation from the general rule, and (ii) such deviation will serve the public interest. *Northeast Cellular*, 897 F.2d at 1166.
