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WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU ANNOUNCES E-RATE INFLATION-BASED CAP FOR FUNDING YEAR 2014

Pursuant to section 54.507(a) of the Commission's rules,¹ the Wireline Competition Bureau announces that the E-rate program funding cap for funding year 2014 is \$2,413,817,693.² Section 54.507(a)(1) of the Commission's rules requires an adjustment of the E-rate program's annual cap based on the gross domestic product chain-type price index (GDP-CPI) measure of inflation.³ The new cap represents a 1.4% inflation-adjusted increase from funding year 2013's cap of \$2,380,314,485.⁴ The Commission began indexing the annual funding cap to inflation in 2010 to allow the E-rate program to keep pace with the changing telecommunications needs of schools and libraries.⁵
