By the Chief, Media Bureau:

1. On February 10, 2005, the Commission adopted a Second Report and Order and First Order on Reconsideration (“Order”) in the above-captioned docket to facilitate the transition from analog to digital television.¹ Each of the entities listed in the Attachment filed a Petition seeking reconsideration of particular aspects of this Order.
