## CONSUMER AND GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON A PETITION FOR WAIVER FILED BY THE NATIONAL CABLE & TELECOMMUNICATIONS ASSOCIATION

CG Docket No. 02-278

With this Public Notice, we seek comment on a petition for waiver filed by the National Cable & Telecommunications Association (NCTA),<sup>1</sup> requesting that its members be included in the group of entities recently granted a retroactive and prospective waiver of the Commission's prior-express-written-consent requirement for automated telemarketing calls.<sup>2</sup>

In 2012, the Commission adopted rules pursuant to the Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA)<sup>3</sup> that required prior express written consent for autodialed, prerecorded, or artificial voice telemarketing calls to wireless telephone numbers and for prerecorded or artificial voice telemarketing calls to residential telephone numbers.<sup>4</sup>

In support of its request, NCTA asserts that good cause exists for such a waiver because: it actively participated in the proceeding leading to the waivers granted in the *2015 TCPA Order*; its members were similarly situated to the parties that received a retroactive and prospective waiver of the written consent requirement; and its members faced the same confusion regarding the implementation of this written consent requirement as the entities to which the Commission granted such a waiver.<sup>5</sup> NCTA

states that its members “would benefit from both the added clarity granted by the waiver and the additional time granted for compliance with the prior written consent requirement.”<sup>6</sup> NCTA asks the Commission to declare that its members are entitled to a waiver of the prior-express-written-consent requirement from October 16, 2013 through October 7, 2015.<sup>7</sup>

We seek comment on these and any other issues raised in the *Petition*.

Pursuant to sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission’s rules, 47 CFR §§ 1.415, 1.419, interested parties may file comments and reply comments on or before the dates indicated on the first page of this document. The proceeding this Notice initiates shall be treated as a “permit-but-disclose” proceeding in accordance with the Commission’s *ex parte* rules.<sup>8</sup> Persons making *ex parte* presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the *ex parte* presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter’s written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the

presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during *ex parte* meetings are deemed to be written *ex parte* presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written *ex parte* presentations and memoranda summarizing oral *ex parte* presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g., .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.
