WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON GEORGIA ILECS EMERGENCY REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED TREATMENT REGARDING REQUEST FOR LIMITED WAIVER OF THE COMMISSION'S INTERCARRIER COMPENSATION REVENUE RECOVERY RULES FOR RURAL ILECS

On January 5, 2016, Brantley Telephone Company, Inc.; Pembroke Telephone Company, Inc.; Pineland Telephone Cooperative, Inc.; Public Service Telephone Company; and Waverly Hall Telephone Company, LLC (collectively referred to herein as "Georgia ILEC Petitioners") filed a joint petition for Emergency Request for Expedited Treatment, and Petition for Limited Waiver of section 51.917(b)(7)(ii) of the Commission's rules. Specifically, the Georgia ILEC Petitioners "seek to include amounts owed by Halo Wireless, Inc. ('Halo') in Fiscal Year 2011 ... in the GA ILEC Petitioners' Carrier Base Period Revenues ("BPR")."

Pursuant to section 1.419 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.419, interested parties may file comments on or before the date indicated above. In order to develop a complete record on the issues presented in the waiver petition, this matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's ex parte rules.³ Persons making ex parte presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral ex parte presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex parte presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during ex parte meetings are deemed to be written ex parte presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written ex parte presentations and memoranda summarizing oral ex parte presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g., .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's ex parte rules.
