**ORDER**

By the Chief, Media Bureau:

1. On January 8, 2018, Starz Entertainment, LLC (Starz) filed a Petition for Declaratory Ruling, Enforcement Order, and Further Relief, and on January 17, 2018 filed an Emergency Petition for Injunctive Relief. On February 15, 2018, Starz submitted a request to withdraw and dismiss its petitions with prejudice.<sup>1</sup> Starz states that it has entered into an agreement for carriage with Altice USA, Inc.<sup>2</sup> In view of this agreement, we grant Starz’s request to withdraw and dismiss its petitions with prejudice.

2. Accordingly, **IT IS ORDERED** that Starz’s request to withdraw and dismiss with prejudice its petitions **IS GRANTED**, that they are **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE**, and that this proceeding **IS TERMINATED**.

3. This action is taken pursuant to authority delegated by Section 0.283 of the Commission’s rules.<sup>3</sup>
