ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By the Chief, Media Bureau:

1. On November 7, 2008, the Commission released a Report and Order in the above-captioned docket.¹ On December 31, 2008, the Association for Maximum Service Television, Inc. (now part of the National Association of Broadcasters) (NAB/MSTV) filed a Petition for Reconsideration of the *Report and Order*.²

2. Due to the passage of time, NAB/MSTV has agreed to withdraw its petition. Therefore, we are dismissing the petition without prejudice.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that the NAB/MSTV Petition for Reconsideration filed in this docket IS DISMISSED without prejudice.
