## ADDITIONAL PARTY SEEKS ACCESS TO HIGHLY CONFIDENTIAL BUSINESS DATA SERVICES DATA

WC Docket Nos. 16-143, 05-25; RM-10593

Objections Due by: May 8, 2019

By this Public Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) announces that an additional party seeks access to confidential and highly confidential information and data submitted in the Commission's data collection (2015 Data Collection) in the price cap business data services (BDS) proceedings, and that interested parties have until **May 8, 2019** to object to disclosure of their data to the party seeking access.

On April 15, 2019, the Bureau released a *Public Notice* announcing that it will reopen the secure data enclave which will house confidential and highly confidential information and data submitted in the *2015 Data Collection*, including *April Data Tables*.<sup>2</sup> The Bureau also announced that for participants in the price cap BDS proceedings, parties that were not previously authorized to access the secure data enclave and now seek access must file a signed Acknowledgment of Confidentiality (Acknowledgment) pursuant to protective orders in the price cap BDS proceedings (*BDS Protective Orders*).<sup>3</sup> Consistent with past practice, the Attachment lists additional individuals that have filed an Acknowledgement pursuant to the *BDS Protective Orders* seeking access to the *2015 Data Collection* and listing the level of access requested (Confidential-only, or Confidential and Highly Confidential). By executing an Acknowledgement, the individual certifies that their purpose for accessing the data is for preparation and conduct of the price cap BDS rulemaking proceedings.<sup>4</sup>

Pursuant to the *BDS Protective Orders*, parties that submitted confidential or highly confidential data and information have until **May 8, 2019** to object to the disclosure of their data and information to

the party listed in the Attachment.<sup>5</sup> To file an objection with the Commission, an objecting party should use one of the methods described below and serve a copy on the requesting party or, if applicable, their counsel, and email a copy of their objection to the Bureau at <a href="mailto:SpecialAccess@fcc.gov.6">SpecialAccess@fcc.gov.6</a> Absent the filing of an objection, the requesting party will have access to confidential and highly confidential data and information.<sup>7</sup> For additional information regarding the access authorization and objection process, see the BDS Protective Orders.<sup>8</sup>

- Electronic Filers: Objections may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS): https://www.fcc.gov/ecfs/.
- Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and one copy of each filing. Because more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this proceeding, filers must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number. Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail. All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.
