By the Chief, Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau:

1. On December 11, 2018, General Motors Holding LLC (GM) filed a petition for partial waiver of Real-Time Text minimum functionality requirements in this proceeding.¹ On April 24, 2019, GM filed a motion to withdraw its petition, asserting that good cause exists for granting this request, as it has concluded the Petition is no longer necessary following discussions with consumer groups.² In view of the foregoing, we grant GM’s Motion to Withdraw.

2. Accordingly, **IT IS ORDERED**, pursuant to section 4(i) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 154(i), and sections 0.141 and 0.361 of the Commission’s rules, 47 CFR §§ 0.141, 0.361, that the Motion to Withdraw filed by General Motors Holding LLC **IS GRANTED**.
