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WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUREAU GRANTS 28 GHZ BAND UPPER MICROWAVE FLEXIBLE USE SERVICE LICENSES

Auction No. 101

On January 31, 2019, the Federal Communications Commission ("Commission") completed the auction of 28 GHz Upper Microwave Flexible Use Service (UMFUS) licenses (Auction 101), and announced the results on June 3, 2019. This auction, which was designated Auction 101, raised a total of \$700,309,809 in net bids (\$702,572,410 in gross bids), with 33 bidders winning a total of 2,965 licenses. Some of the FCC long-form applications (FCC Form 601) of winning bidders were accepted for filing on June 5, 2019.

Upon further review and examination, the applications for the licenses listed in Attachment A have been found to be complete and in conformance with the Commission's rules, and there are no petitions to deny or other requests pending that would prevent grant of these licenses.⁴ We find that granting the applications for the licenses listed in Attachment A serves the public interest, convenience, and necessity. Furthermore, the Commission has received full payment for the licenses listed in Attachment A, as required by Section 1.2109(a) of its rules.⁵ Accordingly, by this Public Notice, we announce the grant of the licenses listed in Attachment A. We grant these licenses pursuant to Section 309(a) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. § 309(a), and Sections 0.131 and 0.331 of the
