CONSUMER AND GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS BUREAU ANNOUNCES COMMENT DATES FOR CALL BLOCKING FOURTH FURTHER NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

On July 16, 2020, the Commission adopted a Fourth Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking that proposes additional steps to implement the TRACED Act and protect consumers from illegal calls while also providing transparency and effective redress to legitimate callers.¹ The *Call Blocking Fourth Further Notice* sets deadlines for filing comments and reply comments at 30 days and 60 days after publication in the Federal Register, respectively.²

On July 31, 2020, a summary of the *Call Blocking Fourth Further Notice* was published in the Federal Register.³ Accordingly, comments are due August 31, 2020, and reply comments are due September 29, 2020. Complete comment filing instructions are set forth in the *Call Blocking Fourth Further Notice* and the Federal Register.⁴
