WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU UPDATES LIST OF FIXED COMPETITIVE ELIGIBLE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CARRIERS RECEIVING PHASE-DOWN SUPPORT

WC Docket No. 10-90

With this Public Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau provides an updated report showing the legacy support amounts associated with competitive eligible telecommunications carriers (competitive ETCs) offering service to fixed locations. As of June 1, 2019,¹ fixed competitive ETCs began receiving legacy support at a reduced level. One such fixed competitive ETC, AT&T Corp. (SAC 549004) in California, was inadvertently omitted from the previous version of the report; the report available at <https://docs.fcc.gov/public/attachments/DOC-357433A1.xlsx> now includes the missing carrier.²
