## Re: Reclamation of International Signaling Point Codes 3-191-6 and 3-193-4 (Los Angeles, CA)

Dear Mr. Carlisle:

This letter serves to notify you that, as of the date of this letter and in accordance with the *Pacific Networks/ComNet Order on Revocation and Termination*,<sup>1</sup> we reclaim and make available for reassignment the International Signaling Point Codes (ISPCs) that were provisionally assigned on June 1, 2001 (3-191-6) and June 13, 2003 (3-193-4)<sup>2</sup> to CM Tel (USA) LLC (CM Tel)—now known as ComNet (USA) LLC (ComNet).<sup>3</sup> In the *Pacific Networks/ComNet Order on Revocation and Termination*, the Commission revoked and terminated Pacific Networks Corp.'s (Pacific Networks) and ComNet's section 214 authority given the significant national security and law enforcement concerns and directed them to discontinue any domestic or international services no later than sixty (60) days from the release date of the Order.<sup>4</sup> The Commission also stated it will reclaim ComNet's ISPCs sixty (60) days from the release date of the Order because "their continued use presents national security and law enforcement risks."<sup>5</sup>
