PUBLIC SAFETY AND HOMELAND SECURITY BUREAU ANNOUNCES COMMENT AND REPLY COMMENT DATES FOR THE NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING ON LOCATION-BASED ROUTING FOR WIRELESS 911 CALLS

Comments Due: February 16, 2023
Reply Comments Due: March 20, 2023

On December 22, 2022, the Federal Communications Commission released a *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (Notice)* seeking comment on proposed rules to more precisely route wireless 911 calls and texts to public safety answering points (PSAPs), which can result in faster response times during emergencies.¹

The *Notice* set deadlines for filing comments and reply comments at 30 and 60 days, respectively, after publication of a summary of the *Notice* in the Federal Register.² On January 17, 2023, the Office of the Federal Register published a summary of the *Notice*, including the associated comment and reply comment dates.³ Accordingly, comments must be filed on or before February 16, 2023, and reply comments must be filed on or before March 20, 2023. The *Notice* contains the comment filing instructions.⁴
