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## PUBLIC SAFETY AND HOMELAND SECURITY BUREAU ANNOUNCES FILING DEADLINES FOR COMMENTS AND REPLY COMMENTS REGARDING WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERT AND EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM RULES

PS Docket Nos. 15-94 and 15-91

## Comments Due: July 21, 2023 Reply Comments Due: August 21, 2023

On April 21, 2023, the Federal Communications Commission adopted a *Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (FNPRM)*, FCC 22-30.<sup>1</sup> The *FNPRM* seeks comment on proposed rules to make Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) more accessible to people who do not speak English or Spanish and to those with disabilities who cannot access messages displayed in conventional format.<sup>2</sup> The *FNPRM* proposes rules that would integrate WEA more seamlessly into people's lives through increased flexibility in whether the attention signal and/or vibration is triggered.<sup>3</sup> The *FNPRM* also proposes to require wireless providers that participate in WEA satisfy performance measures for WEA and provide alerting stakeholders with greater transparency regarding WEA's availability and performance.<sup>4</sup>

A summary of the *FNPRM* was published in the Federal Register on June 21, 2023, stating that comments on these proposed rules would be due 30 days after the date on which the Federal Register publication occurred, and that reply comments would be due 60 days after Federal Register publication.<sup>5</sup> Accordingly, by this *Public Notice*, the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau notifies interested parties that comments on the proposed rules are due on **July 21, 2023**, and reply comments are due on **August 21, 2023**.

*Filing Procedures.* Comments and reply comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.<sup>6</sup> Comments and reply comments should refer to PS Docket Nos. 15-94 and 15-91.

• Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the

- Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and one copy of each filing.
- Filings can be sent by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail. All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.
  - Commercial overnight mail (other than U.S. Postal Service Express Mail and Priority Mail) must be sent to 9050 Junction Drive, Annapolis Junction, MD 20701.
  - Postal Service first-class, Express, and Priority mail must be addressed to 45 L Street, NE, Washington, DC 20554.
- Effective March 19, 2020, and until further notice, the Commission no longer accepts any hand or messenger delivered filings. This is a temporary measure taken to help protect the health and safety of individuals, and to mitigate the transmission of COVID-19.<sup>7</sup>
- During the time the Commission's building is closed to the general public and until further notice, if more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of a proceeding, paper filers need not submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number; an original and one copy are sufficient.

Ex Parte Rules. This proceeding shall continue to be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>8</sup> Persons making *ex parte* presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex parte presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during *ex parte* meetings are deemed to be written *ex parte* presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written *ex parte* presentations and memoranda summarizing oral *ex parte* presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g., .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's ex parte rules.
