FCC ANNOUNCES A TRIBAL WORKSHOP HOSTED BY THE TUNICA-BILOXI TRIBE OF LOUISIANA, WEDNESDAY, MARCH 6, 2024

By this Public Notice, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) announces an upcoming in-person workshop for Tribal Nations. This event is designed to provide information that will help Tribal Nations identify and evaluate opportunities to develop more robust broadband infrastructure and services in Tribal communities. It is also designed to provide information about FCC policies and programs to address the lack of adequate communications services on Tribal lands nationwide.

FCC staff will provide presentations on a broad range of important FCC initiatives that support the deployment of communications infrastructure and services in Tribal communities (e.g., Broadband Data Collection, Universal Service Fund, Schools and Libraries Program). Such infrastructure supports Tribal economic development, Tribal schools and libraries, and low-income families, as well as public safety departments, and Tribal government administration. Participants will also receive updates on the current FCC proceedings that provide opportunities for Tribal Nations to inform the FCC to help ensure that Native views and interests are heard in the decision-making process.

Tribal government leaders, Tribal service provider and IT managers, government and community planners and managers, Tribal enterprise specialists, and representatives of Tribal social service agencies, schools, and libraries are all persons who should consider attending this event. The workshop, to be hosted by the Tunica-Biloxi Tribe of Louisiana, will be held Wednesday, March 6, 2024, at the Cultural and Educational Resources Center, Multi-Purpose Room, 150 Melacon Road, Marksville, LA 71351.

In addition to offering the March 6th workshop, FCC staff will tour the Tunica-Biloxi Cultural and Educational Resources Center (CERC) which, among other things, houses a museum, library, auditorium, classrooms, and a distance learning center. The Tunica-Biloxi Tribe of Louisiana will host the FCC's tour on Tuesday, March 5th and participants registered for the FCC's workshop are welcome to join. Further details will be made available on the FCC's Event Page for this event.
