The applications listed below have been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing. These applications shall not be deemed granted until the Commission affirmatively acts upon the application, either by public notice or by written order. Operation for which authorization is sought may not commence except in accordance with any terms or conditions imposed by the Commission. Pursuant to section 1.1910(b)(2) of the rules, action will be withheld on any application by any entity found to be delinquent in its debts to the Commission. On September 5, 2025, Interactive Services Network, Inc. d/b/a/ IPFONE (Interactive), a Florida corporation, filed an application for consent to assign assets and international section 214 authority from TelNet Worldwide, Inc. (TelNet) to Interactive. The Applicants filed supplements on September 9, 2025 and December 4, 2025.

Pursuant to an Asset Purchase Agreement, Interactive will acquire the assets, clients, and specific network equipment of TelNet including the international section 214 authority to provide global facilities-based authority and global resale service (ITC-214-20031215-00552). Upon consummation, Interactive will provide international service to its newly acquired customers under the authority in ITC-214-20031215-00552 which it is acquiring from Telnet and ITC-214-1996-123-00031, the international section 214 authorization currently held by Interactive.

Interactive's 10% or greater interest holders are (1) Roberto Damian Chmielewski, a dual citizen of Argentina and the United States, holds a direct 15% equity and voting interest in Interactive; (2) Olivia Corporation (Olivia), a British Virgin Islands corporation, holds a direct 40% interest in Interactive, and (3) Claudio Liberman holds a total 85% equity and voting interest; a direct 45% equity and voting interest in Interactive and an indirect 45% equity and voting interest as the 100% owner of Olivia.

Pursuant to Commission practice, the application is being referred to the relevant Executive Branch agencies for their views on any national security, law enforcement, foreign policy or trade policy concerns related to the foreign ownership of the Applicants. *See* Process Reform for Executive Branch Review of Certain FCC Applications and Petitions Involving Foreign Ownership, IB Docket 16-155, *Report and Order*, 35 FCC Rcd 10927 (2020).
