WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU REMINDS RURAL DIGITAL OPPORTUNITY FUND SUPPORT RECIPIENTS OF UPCOMING MILESTONES AND NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENT

By this Public Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) provides guidance to Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) support recipients regarding the obligation of all recipients to meet the upcoming third-year or fourth-year service milestones. For those RDOF carriers authorized to receive RDOF funding in 2021, the fourth-year service milestone requires building out to at least 60% of that support recipient's RDOF locations.¹ For those RDOF carriers authorized to receive RDOF funding in 2022 and 2023,² the third-year service milestone requires building out to at least 40% of that support recipient's RDOF locations.³

The Bureau reminds all RDOF carriers that for reporting in the High Cost Universal Broadband (HUBB) portal, these carriers have transitioned from reporting the geographic coordinates and addresses associated with the locations where they offer service meeting their high-cost support requirements⁴ to reporting the Broadband Serviceable Location Fabric (Fabric) Location IDs associated with these locations based on a list of eligible Location IDs for each carrier.⁵ In the *High-Cost Fabric Order*, the

Bureau explained that RDOF carriers will transition to reporting Location IDs in their HUBB filings.⁶ Guidance available at https://www.fcc.gov/wireline-competition/HUBB-Transition explains that these carriers will be required to submit and certify Location IDs by March 2, 2026 for all locations where they offered service pursuant to their high-cost obligations as of December 31, 2025.⁷

The Bureau also reminds RDOF recipients to notify the Bureau in accordance with sections 54.806(c)(2) or 54.320(d) if they believe they cannot meet the third-year or fourth-year service milestone, as applicable.⁸ Any support recipient that will not meet its 40% buildout requirement by the end of its third year of support or its 60% buildout requirement by the end of its fourth year of support must notify the Bureau within 10 business days of the third-year service milestone deadline—i.e., by Thursday, January 15, 2026—and provide information explaining this expected deficiency.⁹

We direct any RDOF support recipient that is obligated to notify the Bureau under section 54.806(c)(2) or 54.320(d) to do so by filing a notification through the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) in the RDOF docket, WC Docket 19-126. An RDOF support recipient that does not meet its third-year or fourth-year service milestone shall be subject to quarterly reporting and have its support withheld if warranted in accordance with the Commission's rules.¹⁰

Unique to the RDOF program, if a 2022 or 2023-authorized support recipient has not made a notification that it cannot meet its 40% service milestone by March 1, 2026 and has deployed to fewer than 20 percent of the required number of locations by the end of 2025, the recipient will immediately be in default and subject to support recovery. The Tier 4 status six-month grace period as set forth in section 54.320(d)(iv) will not be applicable. Finally, RDOF support recipients that have defaulted early on portions of their RDOF authorized areas but are still receiving RDOF support elsewhere in the same state must continue to comply with the notification requirement in section 54.806(c)(2) or 54.320(d) referenced in this public notice. If a carrier has defaulted on all authorized winning bids in a state and thus is no longer receiving RDOF support, it does not need to make any further milestone notifications for that state.
