FCC CONSUMER PROTECTION AND ACCESSIBILITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP APPOINTMENTS AND FIRST MEETING DATE

By this Public Notice, the Chairman of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC or Commission) announces the first meeting of the Commission's Consumer Protection and Accessibility Advisory Committee (CPAAC or Committee) for this term and the appointment of Committee members, including its Co-Chairs. The CPAAC is organized under, and will be operated in accordance with, the Federal Advisory Committee Act¹ and will provide advice and recommendations to the Commission on a wide array of consumer protection and accessibility matters specified by the Commission. The CPAAC was previously known as the Consumer Advisory Committee (CAC) and was renamed to better reflect its broader mission, which now includes matters relating to disability access.

Membership. In August 2024, the Commission solicited applications for membership for the CPAAC's current term.² After careful consideration of the applications and nominations for membership received,³ the Chairman has selected 27 members for this term of the CPAAC, as listed below. The membership consists of a mix of non-profit organizations representing consumers, communications companies, and trade associations.

David M. Pérez, National Community Impact Manager, Consumer Affairs and Outreach Division (CAOD), Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau (CGB), and Joshua Mendelsohn, Attorney Advisor, Disability Rights Office, CGB, will serve as co-Designated Federal Officers (DFOs).

During the Committee's new term, it is anticipated that, each year, the Committee will hold at least two or three one-day plenary meetings in-person or, if appropriate, by video conference. In addition, as needed, working groups or subcommittees will be established to facilitate the Committee's work between meetings of the full Committee on matters specified by the Commission.

<u>First Meeting</u>. The CPAAC will hold the first meeting of this term in-person on **Wednesday**, **September 10, 2025**, at 9:00 a.m. Eastern time. This will be an in-person meeting taking place in the FCC's Commission Meeting Room located at 45 L Street NE in Washington, DC.

The meeting will address (i) the roles and responsibilities of the Committee and its members; (ii) issues that the Committee will address during this term; (iii) meeting schedules; and (iv) any other topics relevant to the CPAAC's work. The meeting will be led by co-chairs: Logan Kolas, Director of Technology, The American Consumer Institute and Elizabeth Hill, Board Member-at-Large, National Association of State Agencies for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. The meeting agenda will be available at www.fcc.gov/cpaac and may be modified at the discretion of the Committee DFOs.

The Committee meeting will be open to the public with audio and video coverage of the meeting at www.fcc.gov/live. During the meeting, members of the public may submit questions and comments to the Committee via email: livequestions@fcc.gov. These comments or questions may be addressed during the public comment period.
