DOMESTIC SECTION 214 APPLICATION FILED FOR THE TRANSFER OF CONTROL OF JMCC CORPORATION

STREAMLINED PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED

WC Docket No. 26-47

Comments Due: May 11, 2026

Reply Comments Due: May 18, 2026

By this Public Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment from interested parties on an application filed by JMCC Corporation (JMCC), pursuant to section 214(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and section 63.03-04 of the Commission's rules,¹ requesting approval of the transfer of control of the Licensee, MCC Telephony, LLC (MCC Telephony) (together with JMCC, Applicants), following the death of Rocco B. Commisso (Decedent). The Decedent's passing resulted in the introduction of intervening trust entities and the transfer of ultimate control from the Decedent to three trustees, Catherine Commisso, Giuseppe B. Commisso, and Italia Commisso-Weinand (Trustees).²

JMCC, a Delaware holding corporation, is the ultimate parent company of the Licensee, MCC Telephony.³ JMCC was ultimately owned and controlled by Decedent prior to his death.⁴ Thus, the

Decedent had ultimate ownership and control of the Applicants.⁵ MCC Telephony, a Delaware limited liability company, provides interstate private line services to enterprise customers and schools/school districts, and other interstate wireline services in 22 states.⁶

Upon his death on January 16, 2026, Decedent ceased to be Trustee of the Article I Trust, and Catherine Commisso (the widow of Decedent), Giuseppe B. Commisso (the son of Decedent and Catherine Commisso), and Italia Commisso-Weinand (the sister of Decedent), all U.S. citizens, became the Trustees of the Article I Trust.⁷ Under terms of the Article I Trust, the 79.55% direct ownership interests in JMCC held by the Article I Trust will remain in the Article I Trust during the administration of Decedent's estate.⁸ After that process is completed, the 79.55% direct ownership interests in JMCC will be transferred to a marital trust for the benefit of Catherine Commisso during her lifetime.⁹ No other changes in JMCC's ownership occurred after January 16, 2026.¹⁰ Additionally, no changes will be made to the Licensee entities' legal structures, including the fact that JMCC will continue to be the ultimate parent corporation of the Licensee.¹¹ Catherine Commisso and Giuseppe B. Commisso hold the voting rights in JMCC, and they will continue to do so upon the creation of the marital trust.¹² In the event of a tie vote, Italia Commisso-Weinand will serve as the tiebreaker.¹³ Accordingly, the Licensee is now ultimately controlled by Catherine Commisso, Giuseppe B. Commisso, and Italia Commisso-Weinand.¹⁴

Applicants assert that a grant of the Application would serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity.¹⁵ We accept the Application for streamlined processing under section 63.03(b)(1)(ii) of the Commission's rules.¹⁶

The proceeding in this Notice shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules. Persons making *ex parte* presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the *ex parte* presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during *ex parte* meetings are deemed to be written *ex parte* presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b), 47 CFR § 1.1206(b). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.

To allow the Commission to consider fully all substantive issues regarding the application in as timely and efficient a manner as possible, petitioners and commenters should raise all issues in their initial filings. New issues may not be raised in responses or replies.¹⁷ A party or interested person seeking to raise a new issue after the pleading cycle has closed must show good cause why it was not possible for it to have raised the issue previously. Submissions after the pleading cycle has closed that seek to raise new issues based on new facts or newly discovered facts should be filed within 15 days after such facts are discovered. Absent such a showing of good cause, any issues not timely raised may be disregarded by the Commission.
