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WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU ANNOUNCES ADJUSTMENT TO GEORGETOWN TELEPHONE COMPANY'S MISSISSIPPI ALTERNATIVE CONNECT AMERICA COST MODEL I REQUIRED LOCATION TOTALS

WC Docket No. 10-90

In February 2026, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) announced a voluntary filing window for Alternative Connect America Cost Model (A-CAM) I carriers to submit certifications in WC Docket No. 10-90 requesting a downward adjustment to their required location counts and associated support amounts based on the December 2025 Broadband Serviceable Location (BSL) Fabric (Fabric) dataset.¹ The filing window closed Monday, April 6, 2026.²

Georgetown Telephone Company (Georgetown) (study area code 280456) is the only A-CAM I carrier that filed a certification requesting a downward adjustment to its A-CAM I Mississippi required location totals during the filing window.³ Georgetown was originally required to offer voice and broadband service to 319 model-estimated units in Mississippi (158 at 25/3 Mbps, 159 locations at 10/1 Mbps, and 2 locations at 4/1 Mbps).⁴ Georgetown was also required serve upon reasonable request the 9 remaining model-estimated units in its A-CAM I service area.⁵

The December 2025 Fabric reflects 304 units associated with BSLs in Georgetown's A-CAM I authorized service area—fewer than the 319 model-estimated units it was required to serve across the 25/3 Mbps, 10/1 Mbps, and 4/1 Mbps speed tiers pursuant to its authorization.⁶ Accordingly, we adjust Georgetown's A-CAM I required location totals downward based on the 304 units reflected in the December 2025 Fabric and the location density criteria applied previously to Georgetown under the current A-CAM mechanism.⁷ Specifically, Georgetown will now be required to offer voice and broadband service to **146 units at 25/3 Mbps, 147 units at 10/1 Mbps, and 2 units at 4/1 Mbps**. There are also **9 remaining units in Georgetown's A-CAM I service area which Georgetown must serve**

upon reasonable request. Because applying the original A-CAM costs to the current geographic distribution of Fabric units generates more A-CAM I support for Georgetown than previously authorized, Georgetown will retain its original annual authorized support amount of \$160,938 despite the downward adjustment in its obligations.⁸
