The following applications have been granted pursuant to the Commission's processing procedures set forth in sections 63.12, 63.20 of the Commission's rules, 47 CFR §§ 63.12, 63.20, other provisions of the Commission's rules, or procedures set forth in an earlier public notice listing the applications as accepted for filing.

Unless otherwise noted, these grants authorize the applicants: (1) to become a facilities-based international common carrier subject to 47 CFR §§ 63.21, 63.22; and/or (2) to become a resale-based international common carrier subject to 47 CFR §§ 63.21, 63.23; (3) to assign or transfer control of international section 214 authority in accordance with 47 CFR § 63.24; or (4) to exceed the foreign ownership benchmarks applicable to common carrier radio licensees under 47 U.S.C. § 310(b); see Subpart T of Part 1 of the Commission's rules, 47 CFR §§ 1.5000-5004.

THIS PUBLIC NOTICE SERVES AS EACH NEWLY AUTHORIZED CARRIER'S SECTION 214 CERTIFICATE. It contains general and specific conditions, which are set forth below. Newly authorized carriers should carefully review the terms and conditions of their authorizations. Failure to comply with general or specific conditions of an authorization, or with other relevant Commission rules and policies, could result in fines and forfeitures.

Petitions for reconsideration under Section 1.106 or applications for review under Section 1.115 of the Commission's rules, 47 CFR §§ 1.106, 1.115, in regard to the grant of any of these applications may be filed within thirty days of this public notice (see 47 CFR § 1.4(b)(2)).

On January 29, 2026, Ziplly Fiber Northwest, LLC (Ziplly), a Delaware corporation that holds international section 214 authorizations to provide global facilities-based service and global resale service (ITC-214-20000703-00390 and ITC-214-20080219-00079) filed a notification of the *pro forma* transfer of control of Ziplly to Northwest Fiber, LLC (Northwest Fiber), a Delaware corporation, effective on December 31, 2025.

On December 31, 2025, Northwest Fiber completed a corporate restructuring that resulted in the elimination of two intermediate holding companies in Ziplly Fiber NW's ownership structure. Prior to completion of the pro forma transaction, Ziplly Fiber NW was a direct wholly owned subsidiary of Ziplly Fiber Issuer, LLC. Ziplly Fiber Issuer, LLC was a direct wholly owned subsidiary of Ziplly Fiber Holdings, LLC, which, in turn, was a direct wholly owned subsidiary of Northwest Fiber. The pro forma transaction resulted in the merger of Ziplly Fiber Issuer, LLC with and into Ziplly Fiber Holdings, LLC, and the subsequent merger of Ziplly Fiber Holdings, LLC with and into Northwest Fiber. As a result, Ziplly Fiber Issuer, LLC and Ziplly Fiber Holdings, LLC were eliminated from Ziplly Fiber NW's ownership structure, and Ziplly Fiber NW became a direct wholly owned subsidiary of Northwest Fiber. Northwest Fiber is indirectly wholly owned by Bell Canada, a Canadian corporation. Bell Canada is a direct subsidiary of BCE Inc., a Canadian corporation. BCE Inc. owns 94.1% voting and equity interest in Bell Canada. Applicants state there are no additional individuals or entities that own or control, directly or indirectly, a 10 percent or greater voting or equity interest in Ziplly Fiber NW.

On January 16, 2026, Consumer Cellular, Inc. (Consumer Cellular), a Delaware corporation that holds international section 214 authorization to provide global resale service (ITC-214-20130503-00230), filed a notification of the *pro forma* transfer of control of Consumer Cellular from GTCR Partners XII/A&C LP (GTCR Partners) to GTCR Oak Fund LP, effective December 17, 2025. On July 1, 2026, Consumer Cellular, Inc., filed an amendment to the notification. See ITC-AMD-20260701-00192.

Consumer Cellular is an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of CCI Topco, Inc. (CCI Topco), a Delaware corporation. CCI Topco is owned by Cellular Holdings, LLC (Cellular Holdings) (75% equity and voting interests) and HPS Investment Partners, LLC (HPS Investment) (11.72% equity and voting interests), all Delaware entities.

Prior to the transaction, GTCR Partners had indirect control of Cellular Holdings. At the time, GTCR Partners was the general partner of GTCR Investment XII LLC (GTCR Investment). GTCR Partners and GTCR Investment both Delaware entities, were controlled by a board of managers, all U.S. citizens: Mark M. Anderson, Craig A. Bondy, Aaron D. Cohen, Sean L. Cunningham, Benjamin J. Daverman, David A. Donnini, Constantine S. Mihas, and Collin E. Roche (collectively, Board Members).

In an internal restructuring, indirect control of Cellular Holdings was transferred to GTCR Oak Fund LP, a Delaware limited liability company. GTCR Oak Fund LP is controlled by its board of managers, which are the same individuals as the board members for GTCR Investment. Consequently, Cellular Holdings and Consumer Cellular were controlled by the same individuals serving as board members before and after the transaction. Applicant states that no other entity, directly or indirectly controls or owns a 10 percent or greater equity interest in Consumer Cellular upon closing of the transaction.

On March 11, 2026, Inmate Calling Solutions, LLC (ICS), a California limited liability company that holds international section 214 authorization to provide global resale service (ITC-214-20030312-00128), filed a notification for the *pro forma* transfer of control of ICS due to an internal restructuring that was effective on February 17, 2026.

ICS is wholly owned by Keefe Group, LLC, a Missouri limited liability company, which is in turn wholly owned by TKC Holdings, Inc. (TKC Holdings), a Delaware corporation. TKC Holdings is indirectly owned and controlled by Sami Mnaymneh and Anthony Tamer, both U.S. citizens.

Carriers shall not otherwise file tariffs except as permitted by Section 61.19 of the rules, 47 C.F.R. § 61.19. Except as specified in Section 20.15 with respect to commercial mobile radio service providers, carriers regulated as non-dominant, as defined in Section 61.3, and providing detariffed international services pursuant to Section 61.19, must comply with all applicable public disclosure and maintenance of information requirements in Sections 42.10 and 42.11.

(7) International facilities-based service providers must file and maintain a list of U.S.-international routes on which they have direct termination arrangements with a foreign carrier. 47 CFR § 63.22(h). A new international facilities-based service provider or one without existing direct termination arrangements must file its list within thirty (30) days of entering into a direct termination arrangement(s) with a foreign carrier(s). Thereafter, international facilities-based service providers must update their lists within thirty (30) days after adding a termination arrangement for a new foreign destination or discontinuing an arrangement with a previously listed destination.
