We request that such comments refer to the petition file numbers shown below. No petition listed below shall be granted by the Commission earlier than the day after the date specified in this public notice for the filing of comments.

Petition for Declaratory Ruling

LB License Co, LLC

On July 24, 2018, the Commission granted a petition for declaratory ruling to LB License Co, LLC (LB License). The grant of the petition was conditioned on LB License abiding by the commitments and undertakings set forth in the July 20, 2018 Letter of Agreement from the Assistant Attorney General, National Security Division, Department of Justice (2018 LOA). LBLicense Co., LLC Petition for Declaratory Ruling pursuant to section 310(b)(4) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 310(b)(4) (TT # 18-01 and 02), File No. ISP-PDR-20171228-00004 (filed July 20, 2018). On July 2, 2026, the Committee for the Assessment of Foreign Participation in the United States Telecommunications Services Sector (Committee) notified the Commission that it has terminated the 2018 LOA upon which the grant of the petition for declaratory ruling was conditioned. See Letter from Tyler Wood, Deputy Chief, Foreign Investment Review Section, National Security Division, Department of Justice, to Marlene H. Dortch, Secretary, FCC, filed in ISP-PDR-20171228-00004 (July 2, 2026). The Committee requests that the Commission remove compliance with the 2018 LOA as a condition to the authorization because “such mitigation is no longer warranted.” We grant the Committee’s request and remove the condition to comply with the 2018 LOA from ISP-PDR-20171228-00004.
