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**FCC PUBLISHES CONSOLIDATED PROHIBITED ENTITIES LIST TO SUPPORT
EQUIPMENT AUTHORIZATION INTEGRITY
ET Docket No. 24-136**

On September 2, 2026, The Federal Communications Commission (Commission) published a consolidated prohibited entities list to the Commission website.¹ This list combines all of the prohibited entities listed under section 2.902 of the Commission's rules² to help equipment authorization applicants and testing facilities verify whether an entity qualifies as a "Prohibited Entity" according the *Second Report and Order and Second Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (Second EA Integrity R&O)*.

In the *Second EA Integrity R&O*,³ the Commission adopted a measure to strengthen national security by promoting the integrity of our equipment authorization program while alleviating unnecessary administrative burdens on Telecommunications Certification Bodies (TCBs) and industry providers.⁴ The *Second EA Integrity R&O* established under 47 CFR § 2.949 that recognition of laboratory accreditation bodies now requires 1) certification to the Commission that the laboratory is not owned by, controlled by, or subject to the direction of a prohibited entity pursuant to § 2.902, and 2) document to the Commission any entity that has equity or voting interests of 5% or greater in the laboratory accrediting body.⁵

Multiple commenters⁶ reported challenges in identifying whether an entity is prohibited. The § 2.902 identifies these entities through multiple lists housed with multiple different agencies:

1. the Commission's Covered List,⁷
2. the Bureau of Industry and Security Entity List and Military End User List,⁸

3. the Department of Homeland Security Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act Entity List,⁹
4. Section 5949 of the James M. Inhofe National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2023,¹⁰
5. Section 1260H of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2021,¹¹
6. the Department of Treasury Non-Specially Designated Nationals Chinese Military-Industrial Complex Companies List,¹² and
7. entities identified as “foreign adversaries” by the Department of Commerce.¹³

The *Second EA Integrity R&O* directed the Office of Engineering (OET) to create a consolidated list of prohibited entities under § 2.902 for public release. This webpage is part of the ongoing fulfillment of that effort.

The consolidated prohibited entities list provides the entity name, any known aliases, the relevant source prohibited entities list, the country where the company is located, and the relevant Federal Register citation. The webpage offers a search feature and drop-down filtering by the lists designated in § 2.902. The list is updated on a recurring basis, with a “last updated” indicator at the top of the page. Users can also download a machine-readable CSV version of the list.

While the consolidated prohibited entities list is compiled from authoritative U.S. government website sources and will be updated regularly by the Commission, users are still responsible for verifying the accuracy of the consolidated list. It is provided as a courtesy to assist users seeking to identify prohibited entities and comply with the Commission’s rules. The source code and documentation for this website will be made available at: github.com/fcc/.

The Commission does not manage the lists maintained by other agencies. Therefore, it is possible delays in those lists being updated or data availability issues may occur beyond the control of the Commission. Users should operate with this understanding and take appropriate steps to verify the data against the original lists.

Additionally, the list does not contain all affiliates and subsidiaries not currently captured by the prohibited entities lists of the original agency responsible for each list. Companies are acquired, sold, closed, and opened on a recurring basis and these lists evolve as new affiliates and subsidiaries are identified. There is often a delay between the market activity and the addition of impacted entities to the relevant prohibited entities list. The consolidated list reflects the limitations caused by this delay.
