**PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED FOR
COMMENTS ON AMERITECH'S PETITION
FOR STRUCTURAL RELIEF**

CC Docket Nos. 88-2, Phase I, and 90-623

On March 24, 1992, the Ameritech Operating Companies (Ameritech) filed a notice of compliance with the Open Network Architecture (ONA) requirements for removal of the structural separation requirements that currently govern its participation in the enhanced services industry. Pursuant to the *BOC ONA Amendment Order*, 5 FCC Rcd 3103, the Bell Operating Companies (BOCs) are permitted to petition the Commission for relief from the structural separation requirements if the BOCs are technically prepared to offer their ONA services, have effective federal tariffs for each of their initial interstate ONA services, and have filed state tariffs for each of their initial intrastate ONA services. Ameritech states that it satisfies all of the Commission's conditions for removal of the structural separation requirement.
