ORDER

By the Chief, Field Operations Bureau:

I. INTRODUCTION

1. Blackship Computer Systems (Blackship) filed a Petition for Reconsideration, requesting reconsideration of the monetary forfeiture of \$5,600 issued pursuant to Section 503(b), 47 U.S.C. §503(b), for violation of Section 302 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, (the Act), 47 U.S.C. §302, and Section 2.803 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §2.803. For the reasons noted below, the Bureau affirms the monetary forfeiture.

II. BACKGROUND

2. On December 31, 1992, the Los Angeles Field Office issued a Notice of Apparent Liability (NAL) to Blackship. The penalty was imposed for exhibiting a desktop computer which was not certified by the Commission. Based on the response from Blackship, the Los Angeles Field Office issued a Notice of Forfeiture (NOF) for \$5,600 on March 9, 1993. Blackship now appeals. The petitioner, by letter dated April 8, 1993, requested further review of its case, but made no new arguments.

III. DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSION

3. We find that, upon review of the NAL and NOF and based upon petitioner failing to present any arguments or evidence that was not previously addressed, we must affirm the forfeiture amount.

IV. ORDERING CLAUSES

4. IT IS ORDERED THAT, pursuant to Section 503(b) of the Act, 47 U.S.C. §503(b), and Section 1.106 of the Rules, 47 C.F.R. §1.106, the Petition for Reconsideration is DENIED.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 1.80 of the Rules, 47 C.F.R. §1.80, Blackship Computer Systems, Inc. must pay the forfeiture amount of five thousand and six hundred dollars (\$5,600) within thirty (30) days of receipt of this Order.
