COMMISSION SEEKS COMMENT ON THE ATTACHED EXCLUSION LIST FOR GLOBAL SECTION 214 AUTHORIZATIONS

Effective June 13, the Office of Management and Budget has approved the Commission's new procedures for the international Section 214 authorization process and tariff requirements. The new procedures were adopted in the Report and Order, *Streamlining the International Section 214 Authorization Process and Tariff Requirements*, IB Docket No. 95-118, FCC 96-79 (re. March 13, 1996). As part of the new procedures, the Commission has drafted an exclusion list identifying restrictions on providing service using particular facilities or to particular countries for those carriers receiving a global Section 214 authorization. Attached is a draft of the exclusion list. The Commission seeks comments on the countries and facilities listed. The deadline for filing comments is July 8, 1996. The deadline for filing Replies is July 15, 1996.
