ORDER

Adopted: October 23, 1998;

By the Chief, Public Safety and Private Wireless Division, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau:

- 1. On May 24, 1996, the State of Oregon, Department of State Police (OSP) filed a waiver request seeking permanent authorization to operate three 220 MHz stations that it was then operating, at sites other than those initially authorized, pursuant to grants of special temporary authorization (STA). A waiver was necessary because the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (Bureau) had suspended the acceptance of applications for 220 MHz initial licenses and modifications. The Commission opened a filing window for 220 MHz licensees operating pursuant to STAs at locations other than those originally authorized to apply for permanent authorization to operate at the STA sites, but that window closed on March 11, 1996, and OSP missed the deadline. While the waiver request was pending, the Bureau resumed accepting applications for 220 MHz public safety channels. OSP applied for permanent authorization to operate at the sites and on the channels it was using pursuant to the STAs, and those applications have been granted.
- 2. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to the authority of Sections 4(i) and 303(r) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 154(i) and 303(r), and Section 90.151 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 90.151, the waiver request IS DISMISSED AS MOOT.
