ORDER

1. On November 1, 1999, U S WEST Communications, Inc. (U S WEST) filed Transmittal No. 1030 to revise its Tariff F.C.C. No.5, Access Service, Section 21, Expanded Interconnection (EIC). Transmittal No. 1030, currently scheduled to become effective November 16, 1999, proposes to modify U S WEST's existing DS3 (45 Mbps) EIC Channel Termination (EICT) to include connection to its ATM Cell Relay Service (ATM CRS) for virtual collocation customers. No petitions have been filed against this transmittal.

2. Transmittal No. 1030 raises the same issues regarding rate levels, rate structures, and terms and conditions of virtual collocation services as those that are subject to the investigation of U S WEST's existing DS3 (45 Mbps) EICT interconnection service offering. Therefore, Transmittal No. 1030 is suspended for one day and will be subject to the investigation initiated in the *Virtual Collocation Phase I Order*¹. Any rates proposed in this transmittal will be subject to an accounting order to facilitate any refunds that may later prove necessary.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), and Sections, 0.91 and 0.291 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§0.91, 0.291, the revision to U S WEST's


Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, filed under Transmittal No. 1030, IS SUSPENDED for one day from the effective date and an investigation of the referenced transmittal IS INSTITUTED.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that U S WEST SHALL FILE tariff revisions within five business days of the release date of this Order to reflect this suspension.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for the above purposes, we waive Sections 61.56, 61.58, and 61.59 of the Commission's Rules, 47 U.S.C. §§ 61.56, 61.58, and 61.59. U S WEST should cite the "DA" number of the instant Order as the authority for this filing.

6. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 204(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended 47 U.S.C. § 204(a), U S WEST shall keep accurate account of all amounts received by reason of the rates that are subject of this investigation.
