On December 12, 2000 BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. and BellSouth Corporation (BellSouth) filed a total of four petitions requesting modification of local access and transport area (LATA) boundaries to provide two-way, flat-rated, non-optional expanded local calling service (ELCS) between the following exchanges: Oakdale and Oberlin; Napoleonville and Donaldsonville; St. Landry and Ville; Vacherie and Edgard; Opelousas and Big Cane; Morgan City, Patterson, Baldwin, Franklin, Centerville, Jeanerette and Weeks Island; and Hornbeck and Leesville.
