FCC Chairman Michael Powell today announced that W. Kenneth Ferree, an attorney in Washington, D.C., will be the new Chief of the Cable Services Bureau, effective May 21, 2001.

Ferree is currently a partner in the Washington D.C. law firm, Goldberg, Godles, Wiener & Wright and has had extensive experience in dealing with telecommunications and information technology issues.
