NINA SHAFRAN NAMED DEPUTY CHIEF OF MASS MEDIA BUREAU'S AUDIO SERVICES DIVISION

Washington, DC – Nina Shafran has been named Deputy Chief of the Mass Media Bureau's Audio Services Division.

Ms. Shafran joins the Commission from Dow, Lohnes & Albertson's communications group where she specialized in broadcast matters. Prior to joining Dow, Lohnes in January 1998, Ms. Shafran worked at the DC offices of O'Melveny & Myers and Weil, Gotschal and Manges.
