FCC PROPOSES TO FINE LONG-DISTANCE RESELLER \$806,861 FOR FAILURE TO MAKE UNIVERSAL SERVICE CONTRIBUTIONS

Washington, D.C. – Today the Commission proposed an \$806,861 forfeiture against Globcom, Inc., a Northbrook, Illinois long-distance service reseller, for apparently violating the Commission's universal service and telecommunications relay service ("TRS") rules. This is the largest forfeiture the Commission has ever proposed for such violations, and today's order puts carriers on notice that disregarding their universal service and TRS obligations will result in significant penalties.

The Universal Service Fund, which provides financial support to help ensure that all consumers have access to affordable, quality telecommunications services, is funded by payments from telecommunications carriers. The FCC found that Globcom apparently has not made the required payments to the Universal Service Fund, owing nearly \$700,000 in overdue contributions as of August 2003.

The FCC also found that Globcom apparently has not satisfied its obligation to contribute to the TRS Fund. Telecommunications Relay Service enables individuals with hearing or speech disabilities to use the telephone system to communicate with persons without such disabilities, and the TRS Fund reimburses carriers for providing this service. Moreover, the FCC found that Globcom apparently has underreported its revenues to the Commission, and at times failed to report revenue information at all. This information is used by the Commission to calculate carriers' universal service and TRS obligations.

In addition to the proposed forfeiture, the Commission ordered Globcom to submit a report within 30 days outlining its plans for coming into compliance with the Communications Act and the Commission's rules.
